Yogi launches attack on Opp in Hathras rally

Hathras: The BJP is leaving no stone unturned for the three Assembly seats of Hathras under the third phase of the UP elections 2022.

Campaigning is being done continuously by the BJP. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath fiercely targeted the Opposition parties in the election meetings in Hathras and Sadab and also counted the achievements of his Government. Addressing a public meeting at Bagla Inter College ground in Hathras, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said that the BJP is doing Sabka Saath and Sabka Vikas, but in the Samajwadi Party Government, there was sabka sath, but the development was of Saifai's family only. As soon as the appointments were out, uncle and nephew (chacha bhateja) used to go out on recovery.

The Chief Minister said that now there are no riots in the State. Under the Samajwadi Party Government, there used to be daily riots in the state and curfew was imposed. Markets were closed. Now the Kavay Yatra turns out in a grand way and there are cheers of Lord Shiva.

The Chief Minister appealed to the BJP candidates to win all the three seats in the district. On this occasion, he also targeted the Opposition through a poem by Kaka Hathrasi. He said that today a medical college is being built in Hathras. Why was the previous government not able to build a medical college here? A bridge has also been built here.

The Chief Minister said that in 2017 also the pair of two boys had come. But the public gave good answer to them. When riots were taking place

in Muzaffarnagar, one boy was watching the spectacle while sitting in Delhi and the other was rioting from Lucknow.

Adityanath further said that "earlier electricity was not given, now they talk about free electricity. Law and order was not there then, it is present now. SP is saying the same thing now, why didn't they say it earlier? How will the land of Dauji Maharaj will bear such things, that during whose tenure the Kosikala riots, the dreadful incident of Jawahar Bagh, have happened, they raise questions about the law and order situation in the state. Those who were against the vaccine and were refusing to take vaccine, the public has answered them by taking the vaccine doses. The public have made their mind whom they want to come in power".

Maha sees sharp decline in new Covid cases

1,966 cases logged in 24 hrs in State

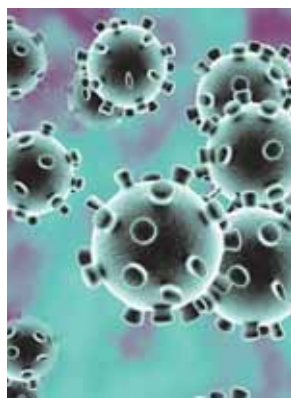
Arrested a few weeks ago, the curve of the Covid-19 third wave in Maharashtra appeared heading towards rock bottom on Monday, as the daily infections dropped further to a low of 1,966 in the State and the cases in Mumbai slid to 192.

A day after the state recorded 3,502 cases, the daily cases dropped to 1,966. With the fresh infections, the total number of Covid-19 cases in the

state rose from 78,42,949 to 78,44,915.

With 12 fresh deaths, the total number of deaths registered in the state since the outbreak of Covid-19 in the state in March 2020 went up from 1,43,404 to 1,43,416.

Mumbai, where the daily infections have been dropping steadily for more than two weeks now, witnessed a drop in the number of cases from 288 to 192. With the latest cases, the total number of cases in Mumbai mounted from 10,54,050 to 10,54,242. While the recovery rate stood static at 98 per cent, the overall growth rate of Copvid-19 cases in the metropolis for a period from February 6 and 13 stood at 0.04 per cent.



As 11,408 Covid-19 patients were discharged from the hospitals across the state after full recovery, the total number of people discharged from the hospitals since the second week of March 2020

increased from 76,49,669 to 76,61,077. The recovery rate in the state rose from 97.54 per cent to 97.66 per cent.

The number of "active cases" in the state dropped from 45,905 to 36,447. The fatality rate in the state stood static at 1.82 per cent.

The active cases in Pune dropped to 10527. The active cases in Mumbai dropped from 2677 on Sunday to 2513 on Monday, while the number of active cases in the neighbouring Thane dropped from 2211 on Sunday to 1973 on Monday.

Ahmednagar accounted for 3815 active cases, followed by Nagpur (3563), Aurangabad (1722) and Nashik (1472).

Of the 7,65,27,895 samples sent to various laboratories

across the state so far, 78,44,915 have tested positive (10.25 per cent) for COVID-19 until Monday.

Currently, 3,48,408 people are in home quarantine while 815 people are in institutional quarantine.

Meanwhile, eight fresh Omicron cases were recorded in Maharashtra on Wednesday, resulting in the total number of the new Covid-19 variant cases going up to 3994. Of these cases, 3334 patients have been discharged after they tested negative in the RT-PCR tests.

Till Monday evening, 8804 samples had been sent for genome sequencing, out of which, results of 7,507 patients have been received. 1,297 results are awaited.

AIADMK alleges police targeting Opp workers ahead of civic polls

Coimbatore: Over 100 AIADMK workers on Monday raised slogans outside a police station here alleging that Electricity Minister V Senthil Balaji was "directing" the personnel to register false cases against the Opposition party's members ahead of civic polls.

Tense moments prevailed in front of Ramanathapuram police station as more than 100 AIADMK workers, under the leadership of three local MLAs -- Amman Arjunan, K R Jayaram and P R G Arunkumar -- of the Opposition party, raised slogans against the minister.

The issue started on Sunday when AIADMK spokesperson Prof. Kalyanasudaram and eight party workers raised objections to the distribution of hot cases to the voters allegedly by DMK functionaries in Kuniyamathur area in the city. Later, Kalyanasudaram and the workers were taken into custody and detained at Ramanathapuram police station on Sunday night.

Protesting against the police, the three AIADMK MLAs along with party workers gathered in front of the station and condemned the deten-

tion instead of taking 'action against those who were distributing freebies'.

AIADMK Whip and former Minister S P Velumani submitted a memorandum to the district collector here seeking legal action against DMK. Velumani said police have registered a false case against Kalyanasudaram and party workers for questioning the DMK's 'goons' for distributing money and hot cases and issuing threats that violated the model code election conduct.

Demanding action against the rowdy elements and police, who were functioning on the dictates of the ruling DMK, the memorandum urged the administration to ensure free and fair elections to the urban local bodies. PTI

Police detain 35 dental surgeons protesting for jobs in Jammu

Jammu: At least 35 dental doctors were detained Monday after they staged a protest here in support of their demand for jobs by creating new posts of dental surgeons in hospitals across Jammu and Kashmir, police said.

The protesters, both men and women, assembled under the banner of Dental Surgeons Association J&K at Dogra Chowk and tried to block the vital Tawi bridge near the statue of Maharaja Hari Singh when police moved in and detained them, the police officials said.

General Secretary of the association, Robin Tikoo said their employment woes have not been addressed since 2008 when the government last officially advertised posts for dental surgeons in the health department. PTI

CBI files case against railway engineer, 7 others in ₹22 cr scam

The CBI on Monday registered a case against a former senior divisional electrical engineer of the Central Railways and seven others and seized several incriminating documents in searches conducted at 12 locations in connection with a scam involving the purchase of non-store items to the tune of ₹22.60 crore.

Identifying the accused as the Kurla-based then senior electrical engineer of the Central Railway as Ved Prakash, the CBI said that Prakash and other accused had entered into conspiracy with the private suppliers for purchasing of non-store items at higher costs, in exchange of illegal monetary benefit from the private firms/companies.

The CBI's case is that ambiguous descriptions of items were mentioned in such a manner that they could not be procured from GeM Portal and "may not be understood by other suppliers, except some set of suppliers who were involved

in the conspiracy".

The CBI also alleged that this resulted in limited tendering and as such the tenders were allotted to the favoured set of suppliers and allegedly procured on exorbitant rates. Such purchases were allegedly to the tune of Rs. 22.60 crore.

from Prakash, the Central Railway officials against whom the case has been registered Vijay Kumar, then Assistant Divisional Electrical Engineer, Kurla, H S Gomes and Anjali Gupta, both then Chief Office Superintendents, Vidya Vihar, Arun Pratap Shriram, then Divisional Electrical Engineer, Kurla and other unidentified persons.

"Searches were conducted at 12 locations in the premises of the accused which led to recovery of incriminating documents related to the case.

The investigation is continuing," a CBI spokesperson said.

2008 AHMEDABAD SERIAL BLASTS CASE — Prosecution concludes arguments on quantum of sentence

Ahmedabad: The prosecution on Monday concluded arguments on the quantum of sentence for the 49 convicts in the 2008 Ahmedabad serial bomb blast case.

Special judge AR Patel will hear the arguments of the defence on Tuesday, special public prosecutor Sudhir Brahmhbhatt said.

The court has barred the print and electronic media from reporting the details of the arguments on the quantum of sentence until the final verdict is awarded, Brahmhbhatt

said.

The court had said that details of the arguments made by the accused and their lawyers as well as the prosecution should not be published in print or electronic media until the final verdict is pronounced.

The special court had last Tuesday convicted 49 people and acquitted 28 others, over 13 years after a series of coordinated bomb blasts killed 56 people and left more than 200 injured in Ahmedabad, within 70 minutes, on July 26,

2008.

The convicts remained present before the court via video conferencing.

The accused were convicted under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, Explosive Substances Act and the Damage to Public Property Act. One accused was also convicted under the Arms Act.

They were convicted under sections 302 (Punishment for murder), 307 (attempt to murder), 121 (a) (conspiracy to

wage war or attempt to wage war against the nation) and 124 (a) (sedition) among others of the IPC, and 16(1)(a)(b) of the UAPA related to punishment for a terrorist act.

They attract a maximum punishment of death sentence and imprisonment till life. The prosecution had said that it will argue for the maximum punishment.

The court had concluded the trial against the 77 accused in September last year. Out of the 78 accused put on trial, one had turned approver. PTI
